Standards for Reading

Reading Standards for Literature

- 1. Cite textual evidence to support analysis of what the text says explicitly as well as inferences drawn from the text.
- 2. Determine a theme or central idea of a text and how it is conveyed through particular details; provide a summary of the text distinct from personal opinions or judgments.
- 3. Describe how a particular story's or drama's plot unfolds in a series of episodes as well as how the characters respond or change as the plot moves toward a resolution.
- 4. Determine the meaning of words and phrases as they are used in a text, including figurative and connotative meanings; analyze the impact of a specific word choice on meaning and tone.
- 5. Explain how an author develops the point of view of the narrator or speaker in a text.
- 6. Compare and contrast texts in different forms or genres (e.g., stories and poems; historical novels and fantasy stories) in terms of their approaches to similar themes and topics.
- 7. By the end of the year, read and comprehend literature, including stories, dramas, and poems, in the grades 6–8 text complexity band proficiently.



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Standards for Reading

Reading Standards for Informational Text

- 1. Cite textual evidence to support analysis of what the text says explicitly as well as inferences drawn from the text.
- 2. Determine a central idea of a text and how it is conveyed through particular details; provide a summary of the text distinct from personal opinions or judgments.
- 3. Analyze in detail how a key individual, event, or idea is introduced, illustrated, and elaborated in a text (e.g., through examples or anecdotes).
- 4. Determine the meaning of words and phrases as they are used in a text, including figurative, connotative, and technical meanings.
- 5. Determine an author's point of view or purpose in a text and explain how it is conveyed in the text.
- 6. Integrate information presented in different media or formats (e.g., visually, quantitatively) as well as in words to develop a coherent understanding of a topic or issue.
- 7. Trace and evaluate the argument and specific claims in a text, distinguishing claims that are supported by reasons and evidence from claims that are not.
- 8. Compare and contrast one author's presentation of events with that of another (e.g., a memoir written by and a biography on the same person).
- 9. By the end of the year, read and comprehend literary nonfiction in the grades 6–8 text complexity band proficiently.
